## Notes on Pronunciation

---

1. The "a" sound in Korean is similar to the "a" sound in "father" and is written as "a" in the preceding translation.
2. The long "a" sound such as in "way" is written as "ay".
3. The long "e" sound such as in "bee" is written as "ee".
4. The short "u" sound such as in "but" is written as "u".
5. The long "o" as in "hope" is written as "o".
6. The "g" sound is as in "go".
7. The "k" sound is as in "kite".
